

Substance testing in Aviation

- Aim: To formulate a Company position on how testing for psychoactive substances should be conducted
- Notes: Pre-flight tests can disrupt the pilot's preparation and mental state. Some will reveal previous use long after the substance has any affect(?) Blood sample hygiene provision not universally good. Needs global standards not local ad-hoc arrangements. Test on flight crew should be matched by similar tests on maintainers and everyone involved in aircraft preparation for flight.

Variation between Scottish and England and Wales law was noted, as was an instance of CVR being played in a coroner's court. The difficulty was well illustrated by the hypothetical case of a jury of non-pilots being asked to make decisions based on a CVR recording which seemed well outside the principle of someone (the pilot) being judged by their peers.
