The first day of flying included learning to keep the glider flying straight and doing turns. It was unbelievable how much flight time we got that day, with the thermals being as strong as 10knots!

The next things we learnt were stalls and doing circuits. Stalls were by far my favourite, especially the ones with a wing drop! It felt like being on a rollercoaster. Circuits were also really fun to learn about, because once you got the hang of them, you were able to be in control of the glider for most of the duration of the flight. Lastly, I learnt landings and launches, and I'll always remember the first landing I did on my own. It was my biggest accomplishment, especially with the challenges you could face flying into Midland Gliding Club, with its strong crosswinds, but this just made the experience that much more memorable.

I would also like to thank my instructors, Sam and Rhys, for being so supportive and for the best instruction! It was one of the best weeks of my life. I am also really grateful for having met so many new people there, and making friends with like-minded individuals, with similar aspirations to mine, and I hope to cross paths with them again in the future.
