Once the weather cleared, we were up in the air. My first flights were unforgettable and even a little overwhelming as I adjusted to the strange mix of exhilaration and calm that comes with gliding. I had flights lasting up to 40 minutes, and while I initially felt a little airsick, I quickly grew more comfortable. With every launch, my instructor, Trevor, gave me more responsibility: first small movements of the controls, then handling launches, and eventually



guiding full circuits. By the end of the week, I was able to fly, approach, and even land under his

supervision. That moment of hovering above the runway before letting the glider settle gently on the ground felt so incredibly satisfying!

The social side of the course was just as important. The other students were brilliant company, and the instructors and staff were so welcoming. One night I couldn't sleep because it was too hot in my accommodation, and someone kindly lent me their own fan, which made me feel at home. In total, I managed around 14 flights, each one a new chance to improve and learn.



Looking back, I can honestly say this was one of the best experiences of my life. It gave me not only a solid foundation in flying but also confidence and memories I'll never forget. I'm hugely grateful to the Honourable Company of Air Pilots for making it possible, and I'd encourage anyone

thinking about applying to go for it. I didn't
